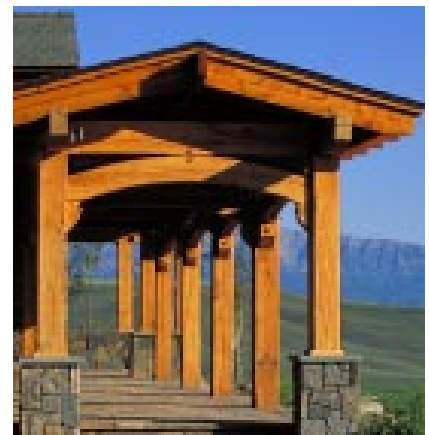


Haase Lodge Gunnison, Colorado

Haase Lodge utilized a unique design theme, drawing on imagery of traditional mountain and hunting lodges built in the early 1900's. The lodge features a fully exposed, solid oak timber frame structure, exposed granite exterior walls, interior granite and oak plank floors, floor to ceiling granite fireplaces, and large windows with spectacular mountain vistas. This 10,000 square foot lodge, located on a pristine 35 acre site, surrounded by a large 3500 acre cattle ranch, sits in the Eagle Valley and includes a timber framed guesthouse with native, xeriscaped vegetation.



The reuse of indigenous materials, super insulation, appropriate site plan, water recycling, and passive solar concepts, all represent the sustainable design features of the house. Further, the open plan establishes a direct connection to the mountain environment, and encompasses the ambience of a 19th Century lodge on the Colorado Frontier. This project was in conjunction with Charles Cunniffe Architects.



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
